

Blended mobility in Tartu – a meeting in nonformal way

From 11.-17. of April 2018 33 students and teachers met in Tartu, Estonia, to try out different kind of non formal activities developed during the Project. This gave everyone a great chance to get to know young people from other countries, get to know each other and learn more about each other's countries and cultures.



Before the meeting itself started, 6 shorter (1-hour) online meetings were held to make the mobility itself more safe and already prepare for it. All of the online meetings were organised and lead by different teams. Mobility itself was also created in a similar way.

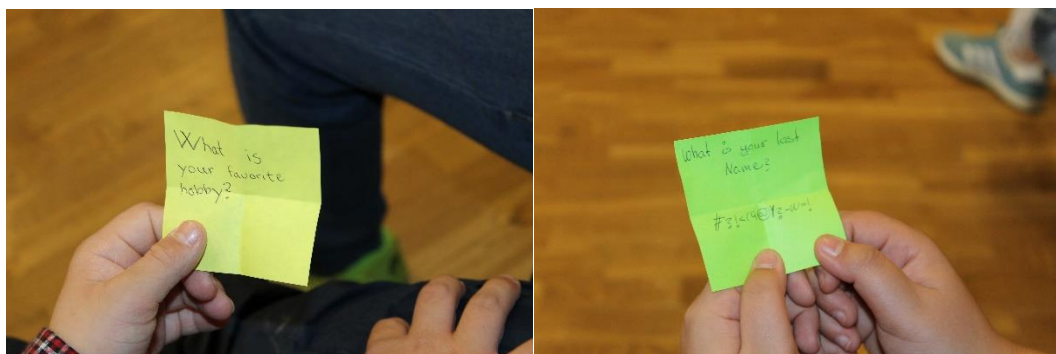
First day was focused on getting to know each other and learn a little more about each other's countries. Romanian team took care of the day, preparing and carrying out different getting to know each other and teambuilding exercises.

Second day of the meeting was prepared and conducted by Hungarian team. Activities were focused on creating a strong team and helping the students to feel more comfortable with each other. Lot of the activities were very physical and showed how physical disability is not an issue to take part in different nonformal methods.



Third day was organised by two teams – in the morning Norwegian youngsters introduced activities that they usually do with their peers in their school. Activities were mostly focused on getting to know each other deeper, thus allowing students to feel more comfortable with each other.



In the afternoon Estonian students organised a photo hunt in Tartu – a nonformal way of getting to know the city a little bit better.



On fourth day Estonian team organised an outdoor education day in the nature surrounding Tartu. The group visited a nearby forest animal park and hiking trails, prepared their own lunch and learned about Estonian nature in nonformal way. Some excitement was created after the bus got stuck in the mud – everyone were very eager to help out and finally we could be on our way back to Tartu!



Last day of the mobility was organised by Turkish and Portugese partners. In the morning Turkish team demonstrated how music and arts can be used when working with inclusive groups of students. All of the mobility was evaluated by nonformal methods conducted by Portugese team.
